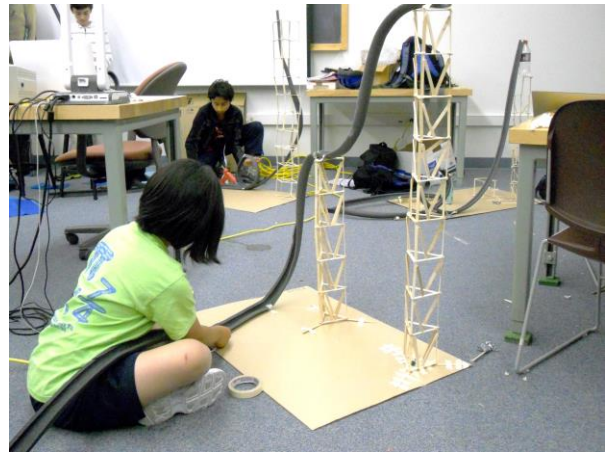




Highly Capable Learning Labs: Addressing diversity in the classroom

The Robinson Center offers classes for over 600 highly capable students in the Summer Challenge (Grades 5-6) and Summer Stretch Programs (Grades 7-10). These students come from all over the Puget Sound area and are in mixed-age classes. Courses are either highly accelerated, interdisciplinary, or both, making it challenging for teachers to address the diverse learners of their mixed-age classes. Participants in this session will have an opportunity to observe the classes and then come together to discuss ways teachers address the diverse needs of learners in their classrooms to challenge all participants. Each day, teachers will spend time observing, and then discussing and articulating how they can engage in strategies in their own classrooms to meet these needs. Teachers are encouraged to come in groups from their schools so that collaborative professional learning communities can be sustained once they return to their own schools.
