AFTER-CLASS PROGRAM

Dear Summer Challenge Students and Families,

In addition to the Summer Challenge courses, the Robinson Center for Young Scholars is pleased to once again host the After-class program for Summer Challenge students. After-class is an optional service offered to families. There is a nonrefundable fee of \$150 for the session.

What is After-class? It's a time for students to unwind after a day of instruction and connect with their peers. Teaching assistants will lead a variety of activities including art projects, movies, board games, and recreational sports with the goal of keeping students engaged and having fun. While waiting to be picked up, students can choose which activity they are most interested in that day.

How does it work? After-class runs from 2:30 pm until 4:30 pm. After the class day ends at 2:20 pm, teaching assistants accompany participating students to the activity rooms located in By George Café in the lower level of Odegaard Undergraduate Library.

Pick-up: Participating Summer Challenge students can be picked up any time between 2:30 pm and 4:30 pm. There will be a sign-out table located outside the entrance to By George Café. When you are ready to pick up your child from After-class, you will stop by the By George entrance and check-in with the After-class supervisor.

After-class supervision: I am pleased to say that I will be supervising the After-class program this year, and look forward to meeting all our participating students and families. I am a 2014 UW grad (Go Huskies!) and I plan to attend Northwest University this fall to obtain my Masters in Teaching in pursuit of elementary education. It will be my responsibility to coordinate activities with the teaching assistants, facilitate the pick-up process, and ensure that the program is enjoyable for all participants.
